CAPTA Requirement

Sec. 204. APPLICATION. [42 U.S.C. 5116d]

A grant may not be made to a State under this title unless an application therefore is submitted by the State to the Secretary and such application contains the types of information specified by the Secretary as essential to carrying out the provisions of section 202, including—

Application Timeframes

Activities Planned for FY2023
(10/1/22 thru 9/30/23)

Deadline for Applications is June 10, 2022

Funding to be Awarded for FY2022 (10/1/2021 thru 9/30/2022)*

*All obligated Federal funds awarded under this grant must be liquidated no later than 90 days after the end of the funding/obligation period (12/30/2024). Any Federal funds from this award not liquidated by this date will be recouped by this Department.



Forms, Assurances, and Certifications

The following information <u>must</u> be included as part of the state's CBCAP application in order to determine eligibility for funding:

- Submission Letter
- Lead Agency Identifying Information
- Governor Documentation and Assurances
 - Lead Agency Designation
 - Governor's Assurances
- Lead Agency Assurances
- Leveraged Claim Form
- Budget

Make sure to use forms with the OMB Expiration Date of June 30, 2024

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Lead Agency Identifying Information

(Profile information in Portal)

- The name, mailing address, and email address of the lead agency.
- The lead agency's Employer Identification Number (EIN) and Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)*.
- The name, telephone number and e-mail of the program specialist responsible for the CBCAP grant program.
- The name, telephone number and e-mail of the fiscal agent responsible for the CBCAP grant program.



^{*} The DUNS number is being replaced by a Unique Entity ID (UEI) effective 4/2/22. All existing grantees can check the government website SAM.gov to retrieve their assigned UEI (SAM) number. New grantees will be assigned a UEI when they register on SAM.gov. Grantees are encouraged to confirm their EIN and UEI prior to submission of the report and application.

Governor Documentation and Assurances

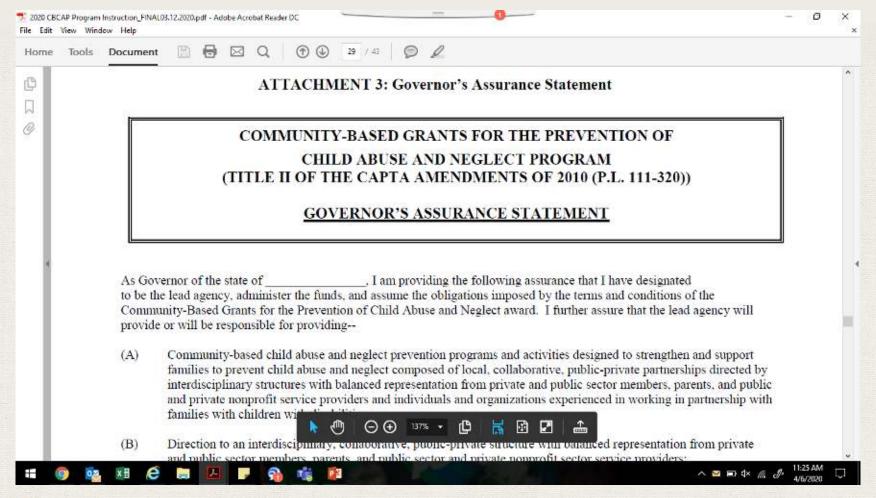
- Lead Agency Designation Letter
 - Must submit a new Governor's letter each year
 - Written on the Governor's letterhead
 - Designates the lead agency to receive the funds
 - Include a statement: "the [lead agency] was designated only after giving full and equal consideration to the capacity and expertise of all entities desiring to be the lead agency."
 - Signed by the Governor
- Signed Governor's Assurances Statement

Lead Agency Assurances

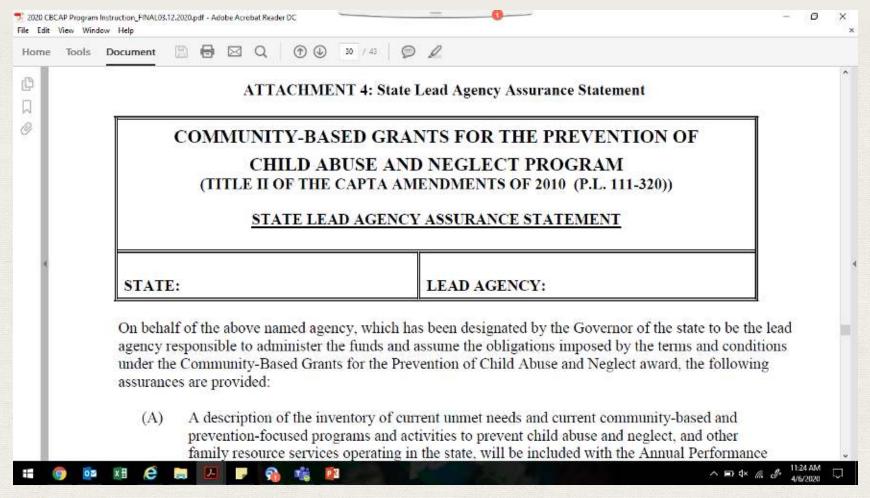
 The assurance statement must be signed by an authorized official of the agency designated by the Governor to act for the State in administering the CBCAP funds and assuming the obligations imposed by the terms and conditions of the grant award and assuming the obligations imposed by the terms and conditions of the grant award

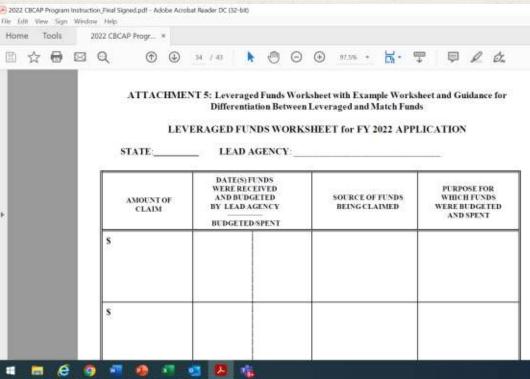
Leveraged Claim Form

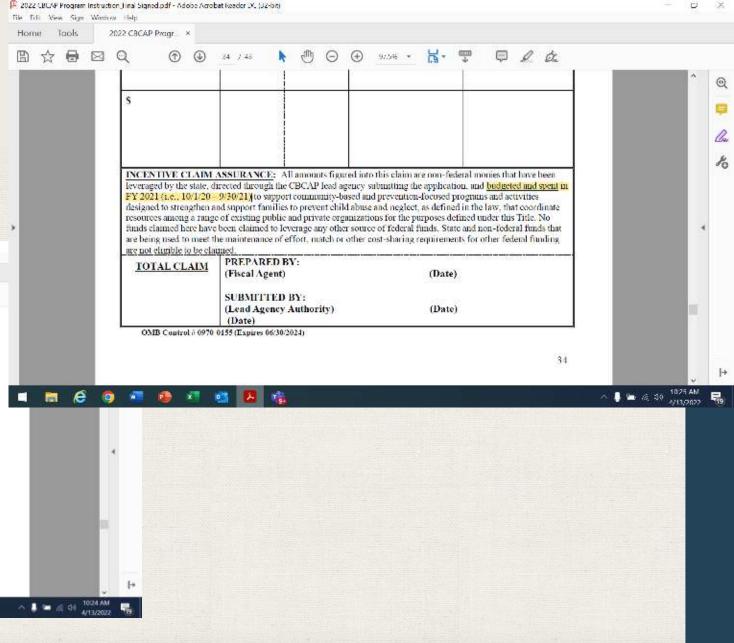
- In order for a State to document funds claimed as leveraged funds, the application must contain a completed copy of the Leveraged Funds Worksheet, which includes:
 - an itemization of the funds being claimed; and
 - an assurance statement that is to be signed by the responsible lead agency administrator and fiscal authority for the lead agency verifying the authenticity of the submitted claim

Leveraged Claim Form (cont.)

- Funds claimed as leveraged funds may include any funds that were:
 - Leveraged by the state from private, state, or other <u>non-federal</u> sources during <u>FFY2021</u> (October 1, 2020 September 30, 2021)
 - Directed through the CBCAP lead agency for FFY2021; and
 - Budgeted and spent during FY2021 for use in supporting community-based child abuse and neglect prevention programs and activities

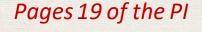

Budget

- Format budget to clearly display line-item expenditures for both Federal and non-federal funds
- Must include 20% Cash Match (state or private funds)
 - determined based on the population-only portion of the formula (see attachment with updates)
- Must include funds for at least one staff member to attend a 2-5-day Federal Mandatory CBCAP Grantees Meeting

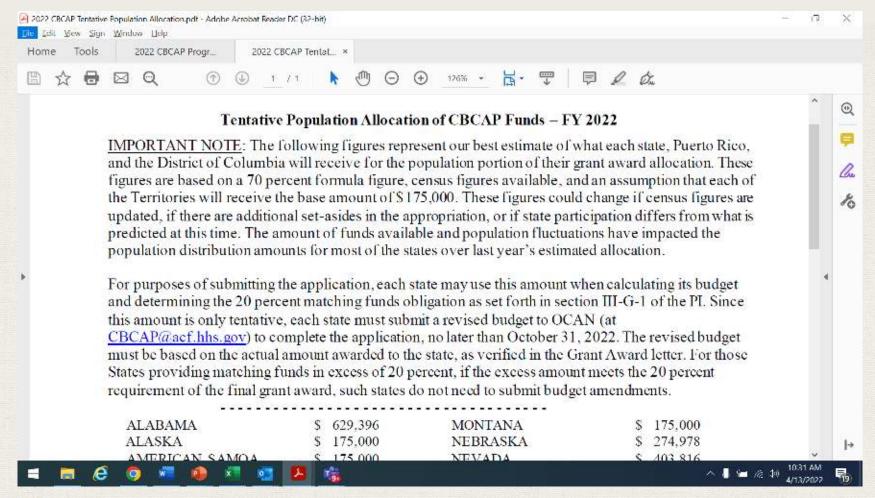
*No longer limited to less than 20% of administrative costs.

Certifications

- Certification Regarding Lobbying and Disclosure of Lobbying Activities Forms (if applicable)
 - Certification Regarding Lobbying Form to be used when no lobbying occurs <u>https://www.acf.hhs.gov/grants/certification-regarding-lobbying</u>
 - Disclosure of Lobbying Activities to be used to disclose lobbying activities that occurred https://apply07.grants.gov/apply/forms/sample/SFLLL-V1.1.pdf

Only <u>ONE</u> of these two forms needs to be submitted with your state's application.

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Description of the CBCAP Lead Agency's Leadership Role in State Prevention Activities

- This section describes the role of the lead agency and how it will lead the child maltreatment prevention activities in the state, to include:
 - interdisciplinary, collaborative, and public-private structure, including its representation from private and public sector parents and service providers
 - how community-based child abuse and neglect prevention programs and activities will be integrated into a developing continuum

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Actions to Advocate for Systemic Change

- A description of the actions that the CBCAP lead agency will take to advocate systemic changes in state policies, practices, procedures and regulations to improve the delivery of community-based child abuse and neglect prevention programs and activities.
- Explain how the states plans to continue or to begin conducting prevention planning efforts and how these efforts will be integrated with other strategic planning efforts in child welfare, early childhood, or other related systems.

Collaboration and Coordination

- Describe the extent and nature of the CBCAP lead agency's existing and/or future partnerships and collaborations with other Federal, State, local, or private efforts and how they intersect with the State's child maltreatment prevention programs and activities.
- Highlight how the CBCAP lead agency's work may be anchored and connected to established prevention and promotion activities in public health or other human services.
- The report should include information about strength of the collaborations and coordination efforts, the nature and quality of those relationships and what other impacts these connections and partnerships have made.

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Needs Assessment and Criteria for Funded Programs

- Describe how the current inventory of unmet needs and the current array of community-based child abuse and neglect prevention programs and activities will be used to inform the criteria for funding new programs and activities for the upcoming year.
- Describe the criteria that the lead agency will use to develop, or select and fund evidence-informed or evidence-based community-based child abuse and neglect prevention programs and activities designed to strengthen and support families to prevent child abuse and neglect; (section 204(7)).
- This can be met by including the State's announcement of the priority for local grant awards or request for proposals (or other process, as applicable).

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Outreach Activities for Special Populations

Describe outreach activities that the CBCAP lead agency and the community-based and prevention-focused programs and activities will undertake to maximize the participation of:

- Parents,
- racial and ethnic minorities,
- children and adults with disabilities,
- homeless families and those at-risk of becoming homeless,
- unaccompanied homeless youth,
- adult former victims of abuse and neglect or domestic violence, and
- members of other underserved or underrepresented groups (i.e., fathers)

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Plans for Parent Leadership and Family Involvement

- Describe how the CBCAP lead agency will implement activities and training to enhance parent participation and leadership.
- Include information on how parents will be involved in funded programs, including:
 - planning,
 - implementation and
 - evaluation.

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Plan for Support, Training, Technical Assistance and Evaluation Assistance

- Describe the State's plan for providing operational support, training, technical assistance and evaluation assistance to community-based, prevention-focused programs.
 - Examples may include training or support related to cultural competence, promotion of strong families, evaluation plans, implementing and sustaining evidence-based or evidence-informed programs and practices.

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Evaluation Plans

- Describe how the CBCAP lead agency's activities, and those of the network and its members (where appropriate), will be evaluated.
- Describe the State's overall evaluation plan and approach that will be used to demonstrate the effectiveness of activities conducted, to include outcomes of monitoring and results of the evaluation.
- Develop evaluation plans that incorporate a continuum of evaluation approaches including quantitative and qualitative data collection methods. This can include a peer review process.

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Evaluation Plans (cont'd.)

- Include plans for reporting requirements regarding the percentage of total CBCAP funding used to support evidencebased (EBP) and evidence-informed programs (EIP) and practices, to include infrastructure costs.
- States that use CBCAP funds for network support/development are strongly advised to develop strategies and methods to evaluate the effectiveness of their network and its activities, as well as their funded programs.

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Areas for Technical Assistance

 Describe any important contextual factors that may impact the ability of the CBCAP lead agency to implement their proposed plans for the upcoming year.

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American Rescue Plan Act Funds

- As part of the state's CBCAP application:
 - Provide an update on the state's planned use of the supplemental funding provided through ARP.
 - Describe how the state will engage with families, community-based agencies or other partners to plan for the use of funds and how issues of equity are informing the planned use of the funds.
 - Describe any barriers or challenges the state anticipates in being able to access or use the supplemental funds.
