





PARELLEL PROCESS

OSDH

- Individualized Technical Assistance
- Work Plans meet contract requirements with elements specific to communities
- Communities of Practice
 Implemented for the Network

FRC's

- Individualized resources, support and case management provided
- Community relevant support
- Peer support and mentoring opportunities for staff

Families

- Received services specific to their needs
- Services that address multiple levels of needs
- Family had resources for peer support and social connections

Explore

- Identify stakeholders to engage in initial planning
- Determine who will coordinate initial efforts (organization and person) and define roles
- Review materials about Family Resource Centers (FRCs) and Networks
- Participate in webinars about FRCs and Networks
- Review Collective Impact Framework
- Host a NFSN presentation for key stakeholders to understand the national lay of the land and discuss resonance with the state
- Participate in NFSN Forum
- Visit FRCs, Network leaders, and Network funders

Assess

- Develop survey to identify existing programs
- Disseminate and conduct survey to identify FRCs, determine their interest in forming a Network, and in being trained on the Standards of Quality
- Analyze survey results to inform planning

Develop

- Convene initial Network meeting(s)
- · Develop vision, mission, and goals
- Identify initial staffing and budget
- Develop operating guidelines
- Determine leadership
- Join the NFSN as a Member Network
- Participate in NFSN monthly Member Meetings and annual Member Convening
- Connect with peer Networks
- Participate in annual in-person Member Convening



- Continuously explore shared opportunities



OKLAHOMA COMMISSION ON CHILDREN AND YOUTH


OCCY was established in 1982 by an Oklahoma Statute and governed by commissioners.






CHILDREN'S STATE ADVISORY WORKGROUP

Primary focus – to research options for developing the needed infrastructure and services for the prevention, intervention and treatment of trauma as well as advancing effort related to hope and resilience for children and families


- Thriving Families, Safer Children
