Understanding the Role of Program Assessment in Child Abuse Prevention: Tools for Peer Review and Beyond is a resource designed for Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP) programs providing direct services for children, youth, and families. The introduction includes information on the background of program assessment in CBCAP and outlines the role assessment has in supporting evaluation, parent involvement, and protective factors. It also includes a brief section on implementation science.

The assessment tool is divided into sections structured around the various topical areas listed in the sidebar. Each section of the assessment is designed to be a stand-alone instrument, allowing programs to focus only on the area(s) that are consistent with their evaluation plan and needs.

The assessment sections include questions throughout that address culturally responsive practice, which includes acknowledging differences in cultures, understanding how one's own culture colors one's perceptions, developing an appreciation of other cultures, and shifting practice styles to meet the needs of the clients' cultures whenever possible.

The FRIENDS tool may be used internally or in an external peer review. Both processes rely on a diverse team made up of representatives from a cross section of the agency staff and stakeholders. The internal review generates the primary data from staff within the agency, while a peer review assessment is completed in partnership with a peer agency.
