Each CBCAP SLA must:

- Implement activities and training to enhance parent participation and leadership.
- Involve parents in the planning, implementation and evaluation of funded programs.
- Provide training and technical assistance related to parent leadership and family involvement.



FRIENDS – Theory of Change:

Parents and Practitioners build capacity to work together as partners

Parents and Practitioners grow together and develop collaborative leadership skills Parents become leadership models and mentors for their family and community



PARENT:

A Biological parent or <u>any adult</u> who is in the primary <u>caregiver</u> role in a child or adolescent's life



PRACTITIONER:

A staff member, employed by an agency, who is involved in providing services to children & families



PARENT LEADER

A parent who represents the needs and perspectives of many parents without speaking or acting in a staff role for an organization or institution.

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


FRIENDS is an acronym for Family Resource Information, Education, and Network Development Service.

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
