**574**

Federally recognized American Indian and Alaska Native Tribes in the United States.<sup>1</sup>

**324**

Federally recognized American Indian reservations in the United States as of 2022.<sup>2</sup>

**10 States**

Based on the 2020 Census, the ten states with the largest American Indian/Alaska Native populations were, in order of their population: Alaska, Oklahoma, New Mexico, South Dakota, Montana, North Dakota, Arizona, Wyoming, Oregon and Washington.<sup>3</sup>

**1 Million**

In 2020, 1 million American Indians and Alaska Natives were under 18, which comprised of 27.5% of this group compared to 18.6% of non-Hispanic whites.<sup>4</sup>
