

Wyoming Family Resource Centers

Family Resource Centers provide on-site health and wellness programs, services, resource and referrals, activities, and classes all in one place, including centralized services with a case manager, so those seeking help only need to make one trip to solve several problems, rather than many trips to different locations.

FRCs provide hope and support for Wyomingites. Here's what we're doing to establish and strengthen them in communities across the state.

We recognized that Wyoming communities have lacked a coordinated human services system. Siloed services, agency duplication, and gaps in data sharing are creating barriers.

Wyoming became a member of the National Family Support Network, an organization of state Networks working together within a collective impact framework to ensure coordinated quality support for families and individuals.

The Wyoming Family Resource Centers Collective is working with individuals and organizations to provide information and technical assistance to apply for grants that will be used to establish Family Resource Centers in their communities.
