MAMA Program

- Mothers in Arizona Moving Ahead (MAMA) is an evidence-based program that provides intervention focused on improving the health outcomes and financial stability for low-income mothers and their families through community-level changes. The MAMA program assists a single-parent family in creating the necessary support in services and resources to survive, become stable, and then to develop a path toward a thriving family.
- Proposed to launch in Navajo County



- No DCS or Tribal history
- Eligible participants are able to submit for payment; one claim per family, not to exceed \$1,000.
- **No Income or Citizenship Requirements**
- The Contracted Vendor would make payments for all approved service referrals for payments towards; job certifications, vocational programs, auto repair costs, dental costs, and mental health support services.
- Pilot Area: 85008, 85009, 85040, 85041, 85035, 85033, 85705, 85706



- Attitudes in a variety of traditional parenting methods are explored and the application of these values through the challenges of modern parenting are covered.
- Focus on story-telling.




