

History

- Began in 2000
- Was once required for CBCAP grantees
- Aided in refining and improving services



Peer Review Implementation

- All staff was trained in the peer review process
- A peer review team was developed to become the cornerstone of the process
 - Comprised of 5 diverse members (Core Team)
 - Parents were a key part of the peer review team
 - Direct service providers were part of the team
 - One person and a back-up designated for data entry and compiling data




Kentucky Peer Review Process

- Peer Review Core Team Duties Included:
 - Peer Review Tools Developed
 - Peer Exchanges
 - Debriefing
 - Results provided by Peer Review Core Team
 - Recommendations submitted
 - Report with evaluation results submitted



Transition from Peer Review to CQI

- Peer Review initially had many recommendations in the beginning
- CQI transition began July 2018
- CQI assists in increasing positive outcomes for families served
- NCFAS-G and ASQ-3/ASQ-SE
- Kentucky Database
- CQI is data driven



CQI Implementation

- CQI core team trained in process
- 4 review teams established
- Parents and Supervisors trained
- Fall 2019 all direct services staff will be trained
- All trainings are developed by the CQI core team
- Each training will include one identified issue requiring resolution
 - For example: Logic Model
