 Mobilize research and practices to prevent child abuse and neglect in Wisconsin


Vision

- Educate Professionals and Community Members on Child Abuse and Neglect Issue





Has been shown to work across cultures, socio-economic groups and in different kinds of family structures.

Population Level Effects

The CDC funded a trial in South Carolina introducing Triple P into 9 counties and comparing outcomes with 9 similar counties with care as usual. The results for the Triple P counties:

- Fewer injury-related ER visits
- Fewer out of home placements
- Fewer (slower growth) of substantiated cases of maltreatment

DAISEY is a shared measurement system designed by social scientists to help communities see the difference they are making in the lives of children, youth, and families.

Why Invest in data system?

- 1. Makes reporting easier
- 2. Fidelity monitoring

- 5. Statewide data on prevention efforts

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
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




Basic DAISEY Design and Function
